† Approximate total cost is based on the current tuition credit hour rate. Total cost will increase with each per credit hour tuition increase. In-state and out-of-state tuition are the same. Registering over 18 credit-hours per quarter requires the permission of the Program Director, Program Coordinator or Dean of Academic Affairs at the student's home campus.

Tuition includes required textbooks for all courses within the student's program of study. Tuition also includes basic entry equipment and materials needed for beginning each program of study. Students are responsible for procuring and/or replenishing any other equipment or materials as required.

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Digital Photography requires the use of a Digital Single Lens Reflex Camera. The required camera will not be provided for loan by the University to Photography Students. Students may purchase the camera from a vendor of their choice.

Students must have supplies and textbooks to begin class.

### FEDERAL GRANTS

- Federal Grants do not have to be repaid by eligible students who remain in school. You might have to pay back all or part of a Grant if you withdraw from school before finishing an enrollment period (for example, a quarter).
- Not available for those who have received a bachelor's degree
- Based on financial need

**FEDERAL PELL GRANT** – full-time, eligible students can receive up to \$6,345 per academic year. Eligible part-time students will receive smaller amounts.

**FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT** – eligible students can receive up to \$2,250 each academic year.

### STATE GRANTS

- Do not have to be repaid by eligible students who remain in school
- Available in eligible states
- Based on financial need

### FEDERAL LOANS:

- Not credit-based
- Fixed interest rates
- Repayment begins 6 months after graduation, you leave school, or if you fall below half-/part-time enrollment.
- Student loans can be costly and default can have serious consequences

How to qualify: For every 12 credits earned, as you maintain continuous enrollment and satisfy other eligibility criteria, you earn the grant that will be applied to your tuition. That means a student's first 12-90 credits

earned at a participating Art Institutes school can earn the grant—up to 13% of tuition cost. Students who earn 91-180 credits can earn the grant—up to 23% of tuition cost; bachelor's degree candidates can thereby earn an average of up to 18% of their tuition cost. Students attending less than full time can qualify upon achieving 12 credits and meeting the grant requirements.
