### Student Achievement Outcomes: Graduation Rates 2021 Report

According to regulations published by the Department of Education based on the Student Right-to-Know Act, the Student Right-to-Know (SRTK) Graduation Rate is published and made available to the public. The rate is based upon students who entered as full-time, first-time freshmen and graduated within 150% of the length of their program. For example, the rate for baccalaureate-seeking freshmen is based upon the number of students graduating from a four-year program within six years.

The table below provides six-year completion metrics for the most current cohort year (Fall 2020), as well as the prior cohort year (Fall 2019) along with comparable institutions. These Graduation Rates are reported to Integrated Post-secondary Education Data System (IPEDS).
