Student Achievement Outcomes: Graduation Rates 2021 Report

According to regulations published by the Department of Education based on the Student Right-to-Know Act, the Student Right-to-Know (SRTK) Graduation Rates are published and made available to the public. The rates are based upon students who entered as full-time, first-time freshmen and graduated within 150% of the length of their program. For example, the Bachelor-degree rate is based upon the number of students graduating from a four-year program within six years. These Graduation Rates are reported to Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

The table below includes the Overall Graduation Rate, which includes first-time, certificate and degree-seeking students; the 6-year Graduation Rate for full-time, first-time, Bachelor-degree students only; and disaggregated data by certain ethnic groups identified by the campus.

In addition, the campus has set graduation rate targets. Targets are developed to account for possible effects of regional factors on completion. The campus utilizes data from the prior year to set targets for the current year. The most recent targets are included in the table below.
