Study materials are also posted on the counseling department website.	The results show that the pass rates are the same/improving.

2	Identify how CPCE "pass" scores are being measured.	The faculty met and obtain the standard for measuring the CPCE which is done via CPCE publishers as a national mean. As a campus we allow students to fall one standard deviation below the national mean to pass, not two standard deviations.	We will continue to only allow students to pass the exam if they are within one standard deviation of passing the national mean score.
3	Help students develop study groups and prepare for the CPCE exam.	Study sessions offered included opportunities for students to form study groups with those in attendance.	Students can expect these study sessions and opportunities to develop study groups with other students via these sessions.
4	Determine what site supervisors are expecting with group work and if the site supervisor evaluation group question assesses what we are expecting.
